

KEELAND BRACELET

Keeland is Gaelic for little and slender, the perfect description for this his cabled bracelet. Keeland is also extraordinarily versatile and can easily be turned into an anklet, necklace, headband or even straps for a bag. All you have to do is keep repeating the cable pattern until the desired length is reached. Instructions are included for a 2 and 3 cable braid.



Shown in: Bernat Cashmere Naturals
Needles: US size 8
Gauge: Not Applicable

Since everyone is shaped differently it is best to measure your wrist (ankle, neck, head etc.) and knit to that length when the piece is pulled tight.

Abbreviations:

K - Knit
P - Purl
6-st RC - 6 stitch Right Cable
6-st LC - 6 stitch Left Cable
4-st RC - 4 stitch Right Cable
4-st LC - 4 stitch Left Cable
BO - Bind off

Directions: Cast on 8 stitches

2 cable braid:

Row 1: K all
Row 2: P all
Row 3: 6-st LC, K3
Row 4: P all
Row 5: K all
Row 6: P all
Row 7: K3, 6-st RC
Row 8: P all

Repeat rows 1-8 until just short of desired length then:

Row A (RS): K all
Row B: P all
Row C: K3, BO2, K3
Row D: P3, CO2, P3
Row E: K all
Row F: BO

Attach button at CO end, then weave in ends.

3 cable braid:

Row 1: 2 4-st RC
Row 2: P all
Row 3: K2, 4-st LC, K2
Row 4: P all

Repeat rows 1-4 until just short of desired length then:

Row A (RS): K all
Row B: P all
Row C: K3, BO2, K3
Row D: P3, CO2, P3
Row E: K all
Row F: BO

Attach button at CO end, then weave in ends.
